Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 112

1. The following is a quotation of the second paragraph of 35 U.S.C. 112:

The specification shall conclude with one or more claims particularly pointing out and distinctly claiming the subject matter which the applicant regards as his invention.

2. Claims 1-10 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 112, second paragraph, as being incomplete for omitting essential structural cooperative relationships of elements, such omission amounting to a gap between the necessary structural connections. See MPEP § 2172.01. The omitted structural cooperative relationships are: in claims 1 and 9 it is recited that the various elements are “attachable” to each other, however this is not a connection or structural relationship. It is suggested that this be changed to –attached--.

3. Claims 2-4, 7 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 112, second paragraph, as being indefinite for failing to particularly point out and distinctly claim the subject matter which applicant regards as the invention.

In claims 2-3 it is unclear how the pivot points can have a “triangular configuration”. They can be arranged in a triangular configuration, but as claimed it would appear that each pivot point is triangular.

Claim 4 recites the limitation "the top point". There is insufficient antecedent basis for this limitation in the claim. It is assumed that this is supposed to mean --the top pivot point--.

Claim 4 recites that the top and bottom pivot point are directed toward each other. It is unclear how a pivot point can be directed.

Claim 7 recites the limitations “the rear wheel” and "the bicycle". There is insufficient

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antecedent basis for this limitation in the claim. It is assumed that this is supposed to mean --the top pivot point--.

Allowable Subject Matter

4. Claims 1-10 would be allowable if rewritten or amended to overcome the rejection(s) under 35 U.S.C. 112, 2nd paragraph, set forth in this Office action.

Conclusion


5. The prior art made of record and not relied upon is considered pertinent to applicant's disclosure. The cited references disclose bicycle suspensions including multiple links.
